Semester dates	<p>Spring semester: January - June Autumn semester: August/September – January</p>
Language requirements for exchange students	<p>Lectures and instructions are given in Swedish and English. Exchange students need to have at least a good intermediate knowledge of English.</p>
Information for incoming students	<p>Admitted exchange students receive a brochure for International Students via e-mail.</p>
Welcome meeting for exchange students	<p>First day of the semester at 09.00 at the administration. Practical information, and distribution of the Elective Course Element catalogue.</p>
Transcript of records	<p>On the student's demand.</p>
Grading system	<p>Pass or fail, the exchange extends over one semester (30 ECTS credits). The elective and non-mandatory course elements do not give credits.</p>
Swedish lessons	<p>Free online course: https://learningswedish.se/courses/11.</p> <p>Interested exchange students can also contact an Adult Educational Association, for example www.folkuniversitetet.se or www.medborgarskolan.se.</p>
Insurance	<p>Exchange students from within the EU/EEA area should bring the European Health Insurance Card.</p> <p>For all exchange students the state authority Kammarkollegiet, covers a liability and injury insurance that applies 24 hours a day within the Schengen area, during the study time in Sweden.</p>
